# **Tight Quarters!**



Mountain currently owns and operates the only set of FTV 550 blade lifters in North America. In March 2023, we will take delivery on the first and only set of FTV 850's in North America. Mountain has a Goldhofer fleet 200+ lines strong and an evergrowing crane fleet.
